Basic and Intermediate Adobe FrameMaker training provides a thorough grounding in FrameMaker used in unstructured (standard) mode.

Starting from first principles, delegates learn how to create new FrameMaker documents and modify existing ones. Delegates are taught how to use FrameMaker's most popular features and are shown a wide range of techniques for generating printed documents of a high standard.
