Whilst most websites today are created using a CMS like WordPress, or through a website builder like GoDaddy, there is another option - you can design and create a static website by writing your own HTML and CSS.

Static websites offer many advantages: they are cheaper to create, require fewer security measures and less server space. They also load faster and are easier for search engines to index.
